## **Grab Your Spiritual Surfboard and Ride the Waves!**

Life can throw many waves at you. The waves at times can be strong and other times very weak. Just like a surfer though, in the natural world, we need to ride the waves. Waves in the natural don't last long. When you go to the beach and watch the waves, you see them start and then finish. They do not last long. It is the same with life's waves. They do begin but they eventually end. Even in our marriages we need to realize life's waves come and go. II Corinthians 4:18, While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal.
